

As the fall progresses, we will be looking to learn from the few camps that opened this summer and will be prepared to implement best practices for the summer of 2021. Of course, a vaccine will be a game changer, but we must plan as if there will not be one. So much continues to evolve, but we are already a long way from where we were on June 1. For example, camps were required to do unpleasant deep-nasal testing multiple times of the entire camp population. The tests were expensive, and the results took days. This is no longer the case, with inexpensive, less intrusive rapid tests on the horizon. Cohort sizes were 10, essentially a cabin group. This is no longer the case.

We fully expect to run Camp next summer with a few changes to our session offerings. We still feel that creating a bubble is going to be a necessity, so we are most likely going to offer only two longer sessions. As of now, there will not be any shorter options. We strongly encourage you to take advantage of the early enrollment discount (December 1 deadline) and secure your spot. Check our website for updated information regarding dates and rates for summer 2021. It is anticipated that there will be strong demand for Camp next summer!

As you read this edition of the Knoll News, you will note references to a QR code. This stands for Quick Response. Essentially a barcode, when scanned using the camera on your mobile phone, it will open the link for viewing.

Graham Pollard's Big Adventure

This summer, WLC Alum Graham Pollard completed the first-ever coast-to-coast crossing on an electric scooter. Graham says, "There is no way I would have the ambition and confidence to attempt this if it wasn't for my experience at William Lawrence Camp. I was a camper/counselor for 8 years and would not trade the good times had, the lessons learned and the people I met at Camp for the world. In the challenging times facing our country right now, I hope this scooter trip is the ultimate challenge that will unite some support for the Camp!"

As WLC Alum Alex Camerino wrote in his article *Propelled by Segway, First Person Scooters Coast to Coast* on snowbrain.com: "On August 25th, exactly two months after setting off, Graham Pollard became the first person to scooter across the United States. He completed the 4,000-mile journey on a Segway Ninebot KickScooter Max traveling at a max speed of 18.6 mph. The venture mostly followed the TransAmerica Trail, a bike route from coast to coast, crossing through about 10 states.

Chasing Pollard across the country, Christian Boyle and Brandon Bedford drove a 1990 Westfalia van with spare scooters, chargers, camping gear, and much more. For the scooter crossing, Segway gave the trio six electric scooters to use so they would not have to stop and recharge as often. The Ninebot scooters get about a 25-mile range. Graham says that even the large climbs they made, like Hoosier Pass (Colorado) and Lolo Pass (Montana/Idaho), were a piece of cake on the scooter."

Graham willingly put his body through physical pain, loyally remained committed to his goal, offered comradery to those on the journey with him and those whom he met on his journey, and showed his true sportsmanship by dedicating this immense physical feat to William Lawrence Camp. We are grateful and hope that, with your help, there will always be WLC Boys and Men making us proud.



In Memoriam

William Lawrence lost a dedicated member of the Camp family on August 4, 2019, with the passing of former camper, counselor, and trustee, **Dick Shepardson.** Dick grew up in Wellesley, Massachusetts, graduating from Wellesley High School in 1950 and from the University of New Hampshire in 1954. After college he had a long and successful career in commercial real estate in the Greater Boston area with the Hunneman Company and his own Shepardson Group. He raised his son Peter, daughter Lynn, and stepsons Chris and Adam Arcoleo in Sherborn, MA.



Peter started as a camper in 1971, a year that found enrollment plummeting. Dick, along with another camper father, Bob Haycock, expressed concern to the Board, asking what they could do to help. The Board invited both men to become trustees that fall. The Board at that time was primarily made up of several older men, some who had served for forty to fifty years. A younger member, Steve Howe, felt that traditional residential summer camps were no longer popular with families and were dying out nationwide. He started to convince some of the members that, if the Camp's enrollment didn't improve, it should be closed. Unfortunately, 1972 found even fewer campers than 1971. Howe forced a summer vote which narrowly passed, stating that all of the Camp's assets would be given to The Episcopal City Mission, a branch of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts. The Camp, while an independent entity, was founded by Episcopal lay people and ministers. As a non-profit, the Camp was required to donate all dissolved assets to another non-profit.

Word spread around Camp of its imminent doom and many Camp Family members in attendance vividly remember the words of Director Owen Carle at the end of the August candlelight service asking everyone to join in the singing of For Lawrence We Stand "for perhaps the last time."

Luckily, many made a stand to save the Camp. Owen Carle wrote a letter to camper families and alumni urging them to write to the Bishop of Massachusetts, urging him to continue the Camp as William Lawrence but Owen heard from back channels that the Bishop had no intention of doing so. Meanwhile, Trustees Dick Shepardson, Bob Haycock, and Orrin Wood (who had opposed closing the Camp) joined together to successfully convince Board members to rescind the offer and keep the Camp running as William Lawrence. (John Thorndike, whom we lost this past May 20, was another member who fought to keep the Camp alive.) Fortunately, a contract had not been signed so the Camp was back from the brink, Steve Howe resigned, and the three leading renegade Trustees took over the Executive Committee: Orrin Wood, President; Dick Shepardson, Treasurer; and Bob Haycock, Clerk.


Dick used his marketing expertise to build a new recruiting slide show and brochure. He also organized recruiting meetings at his home. His stepson Chris started Camp in 1973, followed by brother Adam in 1974. Dick remained an active member of the Trustees until 1988. Without his dedication and vision, many boys would never have had the positive, life-changing experiences that William Lawrence Camp continues to offer to this day.

In his later years, Dick and his wife Jeanne retired to Sandwich, MA, and North Palm Beach, FL. He enjoyed sailing and playing the banjo during his free time. Thanks for everything, Dick. 
